- Paul's greeting of saints and thanksgiving to God (1:1-9)
- Being of the same mind and having no divisions (1:10-17)
- The word of the cross is power and wisdom (1:18-31)
- God's wisdom IS to have the mind of Christ (2:1-16)
- Divisions can lead to loss of eternal reward (3:1-9)
- The wisdom of the world is foolishness before God (3:18-23)
- The wisdom of God causes us to be faithful servants (4:1-13)

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• God has given us wise examples to follow (4:14-21)

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1 Corinthians 4:14-17

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
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- Irony opposite of what you might expect
- Chiding my wife locking the doors (gracious, loving response)
- Child's complaint work them too hard (things they didn't work for)

 Paul's descriptions of his service (4:9-13) – to set their hearts right

- Said in love admonishment
- Said in anger shame

¹¹ I am the good shepherd; the good shepherd lays down His life for the sheep. ¹² He who is a hired hand, and not a shepherd, who is not the owner of the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees; and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. ¹³ He flees because he is a hired hand and is not concerned about the sheep. ¹⁴ I am the good shepherd, and I know My own, and My own know Me ¹⁵ even as the Father knows Me and I know the Father, and I lay down My life for the sheep.


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Jesus (Joh 10:11-15)

⁹ For, I think God has exhibited us apostles last of all as men condemned to death because we have become a spectacle to the world, both to angels and to men. ¹⁰ We are fools for Christ's sake, but you are prudent in Christ; we are weak, but you are strong; you are distinguished, but we are without honor. ¹¹ To this present hour, we are both hungry and thirsty and are poorly clothed and are roughly treated and are homeless; ¹² and we toil, working with our own hands; when we are reviled, we bless; when we are persecuted, we endure; ¹³ when we are slandered, we try to conciliate; we have become as the scum of the world, the dregs of all things, even until now.

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Paul (1Co 4:9-13)

- A good father lays down his life for his children, vv. 9-13
- Hired teachers will leave the children after contract, v. 15
- Fathers are concerned about their children, vv. 14-15

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- "We're not called to follow anybody but Christ, but we're called to imitate those who do."
- Imitate (imitators) imitate, follow (imitators, followers)
- G3401, G3402 1Co 4:16; 11:1; Eph 5:1; 1Th 1:6; 2:14; 2Th 3:7, 9; Heb 6:12; 13:7; 3Jo 1:11

- Paul essentially said, "Be followers of me."
- <u>WHY</u>? Confusing
- Denounce "I of Paul, I of Apollos, I of Cephas, I of Christ." (1Co 1:12)
- How then are we to follow or imitate people who follow Christ?

For since, in the wisdom of God, the world through its wisdom did not come to know God, God was wellpleased through the foolishness of the message preached to save those who believe. (1Co 1:21)

- Now, I mean this that each one of you is saying, "I am of Paul" and "I of Apollos" and "I of Cephas" and "I of Christ." (1Co 1:12)
- elevating oneself and the other person

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- How then are we to follow or imitate people who follow Christ?
- We remain humble and be Christians only (followers of Christ).
- We don't identify or align with any person other than Christ.

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(HBC)

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- How then are we to follow or imitate people who follow Christ?
- We consider the dangers of recognizing denominations.
- We maybe reconsider calling ourselves evangelical or even brethren as this may perpetuate division.

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(HBC)

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- We seek for those whose examples follow that of Jesus and Paul as one who is humble in service and word and doesn't create division but stands against it.

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- We try hard to not compare our walk with others but humbly walk as Jesus asked us in obedience to His call. (Joh 21:20-22)

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- We enjoy the work of others and don't complain (Phi 2:14) or allow ourselves to get jealous (1Co 13:4) about another's service in Christ.

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

HBC

- Does Paul say one thing to one church and something different to another?

- But if one is inclined to be contentious, we have no other practice, nor have the churches of God. (1Co 11:16)
- head coverings

HBC

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- For God is not *a God* of confusion but of peace, as in all the churches of the saints. (1Co 14:33)
- orderly worship

- Now, concerning the collection for the saints as I directed the churches of Galatia so do you also. (1Co 16:1)
- providing for other saints

(HBC)

- I've people saying that "this book only applies to the Corinthian culture."
- It's doesn't address only the church in Corinth.
- Paul didn't shift his teaching from church to church.

- The issues brought up in this book were happening everywhere in every church.
- This means it applies to HBC, GBC, and you personally.
- We need to be careful with how we view the rest of this book, 1 Corinthians.
