

## Commandments

- Deut 6:24: "So the Lord commanded us to observe all these statutes, to fear the Lord our God for our good always and for our survival, as it is today."
- Matt 11:30: "For my yoke is easy and My burden is light"
- John 15:10: "If you keep My commandments, you will abide in My love; just as I have kept My Father's commandments and abide in His love.
- 1 John 5:3: "For this is the love of God, that we keep His commandments; and <u>His commandments are not</u> <u>burdensome."</u>



#### God's Commands (vs. 1-2)

• Lev. 26:1 'You shall not make for yourselves idols, nor shall you set up for yourselves an image or a sacred pillar, nor shall you place a figured stone in your land to bow down to it; for I am the Lord your God. 2 'You shall keep My sabbaths and reverence My sanctuary; I am the Lord.

## Leviticus 26

- Commandments (vs. 1-2)
  - -[1] Absolute ban on idolatry
  - -[2] Keep the Lord's Sabbaths
  - -[3] Reverence the Lord's sanctuary

# Why?

"...for I am the Lord your God."
"I am the Lord"

## Leviticus 26

- Observations (vs. 1-2)
  - The Hebrew word ['eliyl'] = "good for nothing"
    - "...His commands are for our good always"
  - Sabbath & Sanctuary
  - God is crystal clear on what He expects
  - Matt 22:37-38 Affirmatively stated
    - "NO CARVEOUTS"

## The Greatest Commandment

#### Matthew 22:37-38

-37 And He said to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind."
 38 This is the great and foremost commandment.

## **Applications**

- To be holy in our daily lives:
  - No room for idolatry.
    - Devote all of our heart, soul, mind to God
    - Josiah 2 Kings 22 and 23
  - Diligently study God's Word so we know and understand His commandments
  - We must believe God and do what He says!

## Blessings for Obedience (v. 3-13)

- Food Security [vs. 4-5]
  - Timely rains
  - Good harvests
- Physical Security [v. 6-10]
  - Peace
  - Victory over enemies
- Spiritual Security [vs. 11-13]
  - God's presence and dwelling with His people

| Blessings                 | Curses                            |
|---------------------------|-----------------------------------|
| Fertile land (4-5, 10)    | Unproductive land (16, 19-20, 26) |
| Live in safety (5)        | Live in foreign nation (33)       |
| Savage beasts removed (6) | Beasts will devour (22)           |
| Sword removed (6)         | Sword avenges (25)                |
| Victory over enemies (7)  | Defeated by enemies (17, 25)      |
| God's favor (9)           | God's disfavor (17)               |

## Blessings for Obedience - NT

- Specific blessings promised to Israel
- Food Security
  - Matt 6:31-33
- Spiritual Security
  - John 5:24
- 2 Timothy 3:12

## Curses for Disobedience (vs. 14-39)

- Progressively severe and intense
- Covenant-breaking (vs. 15)
- Disciplinary in nature (vs. 23)
- "I" and "I myself"
- 2x as long as Blessings section

#### **Curses for Disobedience**

- First Curse (vs. 14-17): Fear and Weakness
  - Mental and physical illness;
  - Unfruitfulness
- Second Curse (vs. 18-20): Poor harvests
  - Drought and poor harvests
- Third Curse (vs. 21-22): Afflicted by wild animals
- Fourth Curse (vs. 23-26): War
- Fifth Curse (vs. 27-39): War and Exile
  - Cannibalism

## **Curses for Disobedience - NT**

• Galatians 3:13: "Christ redeemed us from the curse of the Law, having become a curse for us-- for it is written, "CURSED IS EVERYONE WHO HANGS ON A TREE"

## Curses for Disobedience - NT

#### • Hebrews 12:6;10-11

- 6 For those whom the Lord loves He disciplines, And He scourges every son whom He receives; 10For they disciplined us for a short time as seemed best to them, but <u>He disciplines us for our</u> <u>good, so that we may share His holiness</u>. 11 All discipline for the moment seems not to be joyful, but sorrowful; yet to those who have been trained by it, afterwards it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness.

#### Restoration Through Repentance (vs. 40-45)

- Confession of iniquity
- Humility leads to a desire to make amends (Pride the enemy)
- God's promise God's heart

## Restoration Through Repentance - NT

- Living in the shadows of sin
  - -1 John 1:9
- Diluted Devotion Carve-outs
  - -Heart, Soul, and Mind
- Abide in the love of Christ

#### Lev 26 and the NT

- Jesus the ultimate example of obedience
- Hebrews 11- HHOF
- Disobedience follows from unbelief
  - Heb. 3:18 18And to whom did He swear that they would not enter His rest, but to those who were disobedient? 19 So we see that they were not able to enter because of unbelief.
- Heb. 4:3 "For we who have believed enter that rest"

## Conclusion
